Are you ready for the next mandate out of the Railroad Safety Act of 2008: Conductor Certification? Do you know what it is? Do you understand the requirements for compliance? Is your operation prepared? Is your training program in place? This **Conductor Certification Training Session** will present in-depth the new regulation which will become effective this year. Although similar to locomotive engineer certification, the regulation will present significant changes to the compliance requirements for certification and de-certification.

Did you know that there are significant changes to 49CFR Part 225 – Accident/Incident Reporting which went into effect June 1, 2011? This **Accident/Incident Reporting Training Session** will highlight the significant changes that were made. The material changes of Part 225 will be

discussed including a review of the purpose behind Part 225, and why your compliance is integral to the success of FRA.
